**To prepare for your Essay I Draft Conference:**

- After uploading your Essay I Conference Draft think about: What you are trying to say: What do you want the essay to say do, show, or prove? (Your major I SAY = Thesis + argument). Why is your I SAY important, & why should readers (audience) care? (This is your Motive)
- Make a **Revision Plan** What you want to, i.e. develop, refine, expand, better support, etc.?
- List questions or concerns you have about the revision process to discuss at conference.
- Carefully read revision feedback comments prior to our conference—you may add more to your Revision Plan after you receive and we discuss this feedback
- AnEssay I Revision Plan is due at the conference—you can type it in the same DOC as your Conference Draft (at the bottom, after the Works Cited) or in the comment box beneath the DOC that contains your Conference Draft.

**Follow-up Conferences:** Tuesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>: Office Hours: 12-1:30. Bring a Revision-in-Progress if you would like additional feedback. You may also bring a new Revision Plan with changes or additions, or questions about the revision process in general or revising your essay in particular.

**Final Due Date:** Essay I Revision, Roadmap, Cover Letter, and any PRELIMs associated with Essay I are due on by, February 17<sup>th</sup> by 11:59pm.
