

Final Project 4 Group Conferences

At our Group Conference, all students will be responsible for (A) presenting a “draft version” or “mock-up” of their final project, and (B) offering development & revision suggestions for the projects of their peers.

Your presentation should be a DETAILED & DOCUMENTED PLAN that:

Explains the overall idea for your Final Project: how you brainstormed the overall content-subject-focus of your project, how the project has evolved from/is related our course (i.e. which units, which readings, which essays, etc.), the alternative media or multi-media genre or format that you have chosen as the vehicle to create and present your project, and both Why & How that format/media will help you best articulate your ideas for/argument of the project.

Explains how your Final Project will get an AUDIENCE’s attentions & address that Audience’s ASSUMPTIONS using a HOOK, STYLE, organization, etc.

Explains your MOTIVE for the argument of your Final Project & what you hope to accomplish with this project.

Explains the important KEYTERMS of your Final Project

Explains your STANCE & how you will plan to communicate that STANCE using alternative media or multi-media genre or format in the presentation

Explains the Argument/Thesis your Final Project will support

Explains how you will support the argument using EVIDENCE cited from SOURCES in an alternative media or multi-media genre or format and how your will might transition to/between those sources/cited evidence using Quotation Weaving & Stitching.

Forecasts which RSMs you plan to use to add complexity to the argument—and has a sense of which RSMs complement your alternative media, multi-media, alternative genre format, or audio/audiovisual technology format.
